Paradise City



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Sebastien Cuvelier's (b. 1975, Belgium) travels through contemporary Iran were inspired by his late uncle's journey to Persepolis, nearly 50 years ago. In Paradise City, his photos are layered on top of his uncle's diary entries. The Iran as witnessed and described by his uncle is far removed from the version of the country seen through the eyes of Cuvelier and the people he met. The country's youthful population has had to constantly adjust to different ways of living since the 1979 revolution, in order to circumvent the limitations imposed by the government. Cuvelier's work is a personal search through both the contemporary and ancient landscapes of Iran to locate an elusive, dreamlike version of paradise. The word "paradise" comes from the Old Persian paridaida – meaning walled garden. The word resonates in all corners of a country where history is full of nostalgia, people are deeply romantic, and flowers are everywhere. They seek paradise but are unsure where to look.



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
